GENERAL

What is the Community Hope Conference?

The Community HOPE Conference is a yearly conference held to increase awareness and education about family violence and child abuse prevention. The conference is designed to offer quality training and information on topics and model programs of interest to:

- leaders in child abuse prevention
- social workers
- counselors
- educators

- child care and youth workers
- law enforcement personnel
- medical & legal professionals
- foster parents

- child welfare board volunteers
- elected officials
- and other interested child advocates

The 2017 conference will feature our keynote speaker, Christina McDonald, along with a Choices Simulation, allowing participants to experience the challenges and hurdles people go through that can lead to poor choices. The 2017 conference will bring you a different set of education than we have ever offered before.

What is the cost to attend the conference?

The Alliance has worked extremely hard to keep the conference affordable to everyone to attend. This year the cost structure is as follows:

\$25 to attend conference all day (Pre-registration)	\$60 to attend conference all day and receive a CEU certificate
\$25 registration will end April 5th.	See CEU section for any questions about CEU certificates.
\$30 to attend conference all day.	\$10 Students, Foster and Adoptive families
Cost to attend will increase to \$30 starting April 6th and apply to day of conference ticket purchases.	Verification may be required for discounted rates.

What times will the Conference be held?

Doors will open for check-in and on-site registration at 8:00 am Friday, April 7, 2017.

Where is the conference located?

The conference will be located at The Church at Brookwood, 600 East 50th Street Joplin, MO 64804. The church is located across from the new Mercy Hospital next to Interstate I-44. For detailed directions, click on the directions tab under the conference page.

Can I pay by check or cash?

Our online system only accepts payment via credit card or PayPal. If you require payment via a check or cash, an Alliance staff member will need to register you manually. To do this, please visit our office located at 1027 S. Main Street, Lower Level Suite 7 of the Gryphon Building, Joplin, MO 64801. Office hours are Monday through Thursday 8:30 am- 5:00 pm. There will be a \$30 fee for all returned checks. Please email cboyd@theallianceofswmo.org for assistance.

Can I pay on-site?

We do allow on-site registrations and payment. The fee for onsite registration is \$30. You will need to complete a form at the registration area and submit payment in the amount due for your registration. Please be aware this will slow down your check-in time. **Pre-registration is encouraged**.

REGISTRATION

How do I register for the conference?

You can register online at www.theallianceofswmo.org and click on Hope Conference 2017.

Can I register a group?

Yes, groups are absolutely welcome. After clicking on TICKETS on Eventbrite you will be asked to choose individual or Organization. Choose Organization. Fill in the top portion of the registration for the group leader. After this area is complete fill in the registration for each attendee. Please note, you will have to repeat the group leader if they are planning on attending. Can I transfer my registration to another person?

Yes. You will need to contact cboyd@theallianceofswmo.org with the name of the original attendee and the individual replacing him/her. We may ask that you submit an updated registration form (that you will receive

via email) so that we have all of the necessary details of the new attendee. Some additional fees may apply if transfer includes a change to the ticket choice.

What are the registration deadlines?

Please refer to registration cost changes above. Online registration will remain open until Noon on April 7th, 2017.

Can I get my money refunded if I can't attend?

Attendees must contact Christine Boyd no later than April 1, 2017 to cancel your registration for the 2016 Community Hope Conference. For cancellations made <u>by April 1, 2017</u>, your registration fee will be refunded **less** a \$10/registration (\$5 for Students, Foster or Adoptive registration) cancellation processing fee.

Cancellation requests must identify the registrant's name, email address, and proof of payment. Send cancellation requests to cboyd@theallianceofswmo.org.

No refunds will be given for cancellations made after April 1, 2017.

CEU, CLOCK HOURS, AND OTHER CERTIFICATES

What are C.E.U's?

CEU stands for Continuing Education Unit. A CEU is a unit of credit equal to ten hours of participation in an accredited program designed for professionals with certificates or licenses to practice various professions.

Please be sure if you are in need of C.E.U credits before choosing this option when registering. <u>Refunds will not</u> be issued if a mistake is made.

What will I receive if I choose to receive C.E.U. credit?

Attendees that register with the C.E.U addition option will receive a certificate issued from Missouri University Extension located in Springfield, Missouri.

To process credit we will need to gather the following information: Full name, current addresses, phone number, birth date, and the last 4 numbers of attendees social security number.

Each hour of training equates to .1 CEU's.

Processing of credits and certificates can take up to 8 weeks.

Clock hours, Foster Parent or other Attendance certificates:

During registration attendees will be required to answer a question "Do you require a certificate of attendance?". For all attendees that answer this question, YES, a certificate of attendance will be emailed to the email address provided during registration. Certificates will be issued within 10 days after the conference has ended. If other clock hour documentation is needed registrants will need to contact Christine Boyd with a request at either 417-782-9899 or cboyd@theallianceofswmo.org.

MOPD ID Credit

The Alliance will be logging attendance on the MO Open website. Upon registration please provide your 6 digit MOPD ID number. Credit will be logged on the open website within 7 days after the conference.

What is a MOPD ID?

MOPD ID is a six-digit number assigned to an individual as a way to connect them to their completed trainings. OPEN does not know any additional information about the person other than the information provided to create the MOPD ID. An individual having only a MOPD ID has very limited access to the information in the MOPD system. They can print a MOPD ID card from the Toolbox, or see the summary of their training hours for the current or previous year, but do not have access to more detailed information, such as their personal training report.

A member of the MOPD Registry has provided personal, demographic, employment, and education information to OPEN, in addition to having a MOPD ID. As a member of the registry you will have access to all of their professional development information, including detailed information about your training. MOPD Registry membership benefits the early childhood and school age profession by providing aggregate data about the state of the workforce in Missouri, which can influence opportunities for advocacy on behalf of the profession and policy that affects the profession.
